Alexander Devine Children's Hospice Service is a charity that provides specialist palliative care and vital support to children with life-limiting and life-threatening conditions, and their families, across Berkshire and into surrounding counties.

The charity was founded in 2007 by John and Fiona Devine in memory of their son, Alexander, who sadly passed away from a rare brain tumour in 2006. Their personal experience led them to realise there was a desperate need for a local children's hospice service with a hospice facility within Berkshire.

Alexander Devine Children's Hospice Service provides palliative and end of life care to babies, children and young people with a life-limiting or life-threatening condition aged 0 – 19.

We currently support over 200 children and their families, but we are committed to growing our service and reaching out to every child and their family that needs us.

Our Inspiration

It all began with a very special boy – Alexander

Alexander was just four when he was diagnosed with a rare brain tumour. Without a children's hospice in Berkshire, he and his family would have to travel for hours in the car to access the specialist care he needed. These journeys were difficult and often dangerous due to his medical condition.

Alexander endured four and a half years of operations, treatments and therapy, but sadly died at the age of eight.

In 2007, Fiona and John established

Alexander Devine Children's Hospice Service and so began their journey to make sure that children, like their son Alexander, and families likes theirs, would be able to access the support they needed closer to home.

2023-24 has been an incredible year for our children's hospice service

On behalf of the Trustees, Senior Management Team and the wider team of Alexander Devine, I am pleased share our impact report for 2023/2024.

For the Third Sector as a whole, it has proven to be another challenging year. With hard work, determination, commitment, and a philosophy that reflects our values and culture, yet again the team at Alexander Devine has risen to every challenge and obstacle placed in front of them and I am extremely proud of all that has been achieved by our staff team, volunteers, supporters, and donors. This has enabled us to support a growing number of babies, children, young people and their families.

Over the year there has been a 30% increase in referrals to our service, with over a third of new referrals receiving end-of-life care. In the last year alone there has been a total increase to 60% in the children we have supported at end-of-life.

The need for our service has never been greater.

Whilst recruitment remains challenging, we have extended our service provision in delivering more inpatient day care, play therapy, family support and overnight respite as well as introducing hydrotherapy and physiotherapy sessions. The appointment of Dr Ella Ambrose, Paediatric Consultant to our team certainly marks another milestone for Alexander Devine.

We remain ambitious in continuing to increase our capacity, to reach out to more children and families that need us.

Over the next year our attention continues to focus on financial sustainability. One way of achieving this, is in the development of our fundraising team, the other vital arm of our service. The appointment of a new Director of Fundraising, the expansion of existing income generation streams and investment in new ones will help us to accomplish this.

More than ever the generous support, commitment and kindness of our community is the foundation on which we will continue to grow. It would not be possible to provide the specialist care that we do, without the incredible support of people like you. I could not be more grateful for your continued help.

Franké

When Franké was just four weeks old, he stopped breathing. This frightening episode led doctors to discover that Franké has a genetic condition and a number of complex health conditions including severe heart abnormalities. By the time he was two a half years old, Franké had undergone nine surgeries, including several open heart surgeries.

When he was four years old, his Mum Sarah was told that sadly there was nothing more the medical teams could do for him and he was given a terminal diagnosis. Franké and Sarah were referred to their local children's hospice service, Alexander Devine.

Initially, Alexander's Nurses and Carers visited them at home to provide specialist care and play, along with counselling sessions for Sarah with our Family Support Worker. Gradually Franké came in for Day care and overnight stays to give Sarah much-needed respite.

Our Clinical Nurse Specialists have provided symptom management for Franké to enable him to remain out of hospital as much as possible. They have also helped Sarah in thinking about what her wishes for Franké might be when his condition deteriorates and there is a need for end of life care.

A couple of years ago the thought of leaving him with anyone else was just horrendous. However, Alexander Devine has opened up both of our worlds. I know that I can leave Franké with them and have peace of mind and utter trust that the wonderful and amazing team will love and look after my boy.

I don't think the team at Alexander Devine will ever know the extent to which they make my life so much easier. They are all truly amazing and I don't know what I would do without them.

Growing our service

In the last 12 months, we were able to extend the amount of care delivered to children and families at the hospice and across the community.

We are proud to have delivered:

182% more overnight respite at the hospice

more children and families supported by Alexander Devine

more end of life care, at the hospice and in the community, and bereavement support

The appointment of a Consultant Paediatrician with a special interest in palliative care.

Introduction of physiotherapy and hydrotherapy support with the appointment of a part time physiotherapist

Listening to our Families

In our 2023 Family Survey, families told us they would really value access to even more Day care, Splash sessions and Overnight respite. 22% of the families who responded also really wanted physiotherapy support.

We are therefore delighted to have appointed a part-time specialist paediatric physiotherapist, who offers land-based physiotherapy and hydrotherapy sessions in the hospice pool, individually and in groups. She also visits children at home to help with home physio plans, working closely with parents to assist them in caring for their child and ensuring they have appropriate equipment.



We also have a new music and positioning group held once a month which is run by our Alexander's Physiotherapist and our Music Therapist. During these sessions, the children are assisted into different positions whilst accompanied by a song or piece of music.

Pippa

Pippa was born with multiple complex conditions including chronic lung disease, Down's syndrome and a severe form of epilepsy, which causes life-threatening seizures, on a daily basis. Pippa is non-verbal, has global development delay, requires feeding through a peg in her tummy and cannot support her own body weight independently. Pippa could stop breathing at any moment so can never be left on her own and she requires round the clock care.

Alexander Devine supports the family by providing respite for Pippa at home and in the hospice, as well as symptom management for Pippa's complex health needs. We also offer hydrotherapy in our pool and provide Pippa's older brother Elliot, with sibling support, spending time with other children his age in a similar family situation.

We don't know what we would do without Alexander Devine Children's Hospice Service. The day care and respite support mean we have some time to recoup.

There aren't many places we can go as a family that are accessible and where we feel safe. At the hospice we can just be a family and make family memories, playing, swimming, or just relaxing and having a cuddle. We don't have to wear all the other hats; nurse, carer, physio, occupational therapist. We can just be Mum, Dad and a brother.



How we cover our costs


How we spend our money



We depend significantly on the kindness and support of individuals within our community to provide specialist care and vital support to children facing life-limiting and life-threatening conditions, as well as their families, spanning Berkshire and neighbouring counties.

Our income for the year was £2.2million.*

*This excludes a one-off windfall we received during this period



For every £1 we spend 81.7p is spent on providing specialist care and support.

In 2023-24, the annual cost of running our children's hospice service was £2.54 Million (22.7% increase from 2022/2023).

For every £1 we spent on fundraising generated a £4.73 return.
